



## Ouston Primary school: School Improvement Plan 2019-20

The Sport Premium is an amount of money which the government has agreed to allocate schools for the next academic year (2019-20). The funding amount schools receive is based upon the number of children of primary age the school has. The sport premium is to be used to increase the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision and increase the participation in PE and sport.

At Ouston Primary School we strive to promote healthy and active lifestyles and aim to provide sporting opportunities for all.

The premium funding must be used to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE, physical activity and sport. This means the funding should be used to:

- Develop or add to the PE, physical activity and sport activities that we already offer
- Increase the participation of **all** pupils in regular physical activity – at least 30 mins a day in school
- Raise the profile of PE and sport across the school
- Develop the confidence, knowledge and skills of staff in teaching primary PE and sport
- Provide a broad experience of sport and activities to children
- Increase participation in competitive sport

Below is a breakdown of how the funding for 2019/20 was planned to be spent and a review of these targets and activities.

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The school has bought into the Durham and Chester-le-Street Schools Sports Partnership Programme which will cover many of the above aspects. This year we have decided to buy in at the Bronze level which costs **£3975**

This includes:

- Access to a fully organised annual programme of competitions, tournaments and festivals in addition to the National School Games
- Access to flagship events (Durham DASH, mini Olympics, Dance Festival)
- The provision of 5 buses to festivals/competitions
- Access to Gifted & Talented multi-skill academies
- Access to Disability Gifted & Talented multi-skill academy
- 2 full day/4 half days of an experienced PE specialist time to support PE Co-ordinator
- Centrally co-ordinated development opportunities for staff
- Access to the Destinaton Judo scheme
- Online & telephone support
- Intra-school virtual competitions
- Reporting Service for Ofsted
- 18 hours of high quality dance coaching
- ½ day Zumba kids

The children at the school enjoy sport and physical activity. During lunch and playtimes, children are active playing football and various other games. They take part in sporting competitions, understanding the importance of doing their best and being part of a team. Children continued to be active during lockdown, taking part in virtual competitions including the Durham Dash and Sports Day. Many also sent photos of themselves out on bike rides or walks. PE has a high profile in school with sports awards being given to Y6 leavers. These include player's player of the season as well as an all-round sports award. The children in Y5 and Y6 also have the opportunity to take part in Bikeability where they learn how to ride safely. Sport and physical activity in the school builds children's self-esteem and self-confidence. They are encouraged to see how they have improved throughout the year in different activities and offered a range of different opportunities which hopefully gives all children the opportunity to find something they enjoy. Many children have joined sports clubs and activities in the local area.

The sports premium funding allows us to give ALL children the opportunity to have a go at a range of different sports (by buying in coaches for after school clubs as well as buying in fun activity days) and gives us the opportunity to allow more KS2 children the opportunity to take part in safe competition. Staff are able to develop their own skills with available CPD opportunities, which improves the teaching of PE within the school. Funding also allows the school make sure that equipment is adequate, up to date, safe and plentiful for the children to use.
